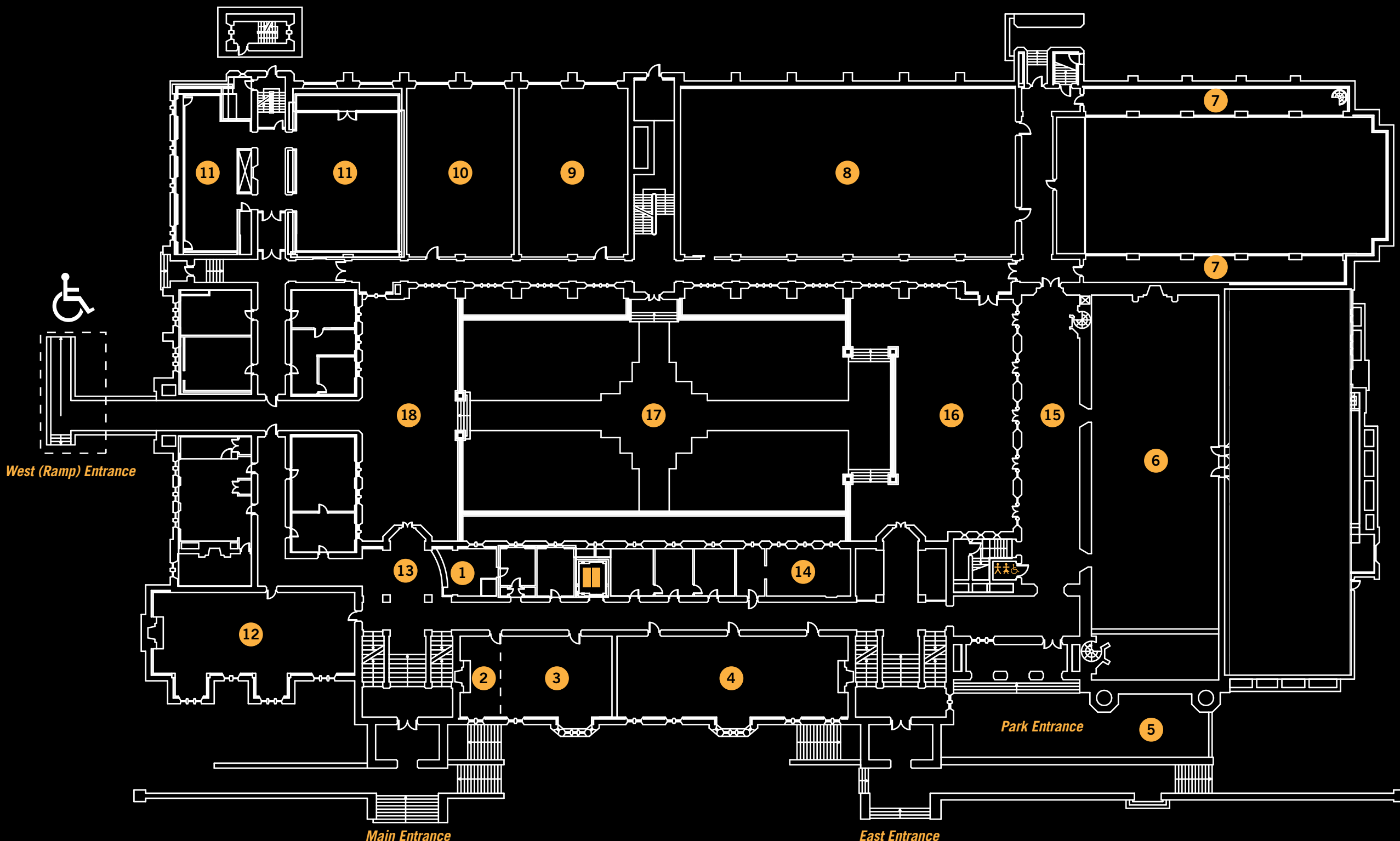

- 3 Map Room**
 - Named for A. Scott Carter's *Map of the University of Toronto (1937)*, which is a complete survey of the University and campus at the time.
- 4 East Common Room**
- 5 Founders Prayer Walkway**
- 6 Great Hall**
 - The portraits on the wall are of former Hart House Wardens.
 - One of the most remarkable features is the Gothic Tower complete with windows and crenellations masking a circular stone staircase.
 - Travertine floor, oak wainscoting, timber arches supported by carved stone corbels, hand painted stained-glass windows, gothic stone gargoyles, open timber hammer-beam roof.
 - Milton's *Areopagitica (1644)* – 100 yard gilded inscription encircles the room - symbolic of freedom of speech.
 - South wall - Coats of arms of 51 Universities in the British Empire and of the British Royal family.
 - North wall – Coats of arms of 74 universities in countries allied with Canada and Britain in WWI.
- 7 Pool Gallery**
 - Breathtaking art deco swimming pool surrounded by elegant vaulted arches and a full length skylight.

 - The gallery produces innovative exhibitions and programmes related to contemporary art in all media; it develops and cares for the Hart House permanent art collection displayed throughout the building.

 - Portions of the stained glass window are reclaimed from European churches destroyed during WWI.
 - Window & wall mural designed by artist Will Ogilvie.

 - Located 1 hour outside of Toronto on 150 acres in the Caledon Hills on the ridge of the Niagara Escarpment.



Exterior Points of Interest:

Hand sculpted detail - Gargoyles, medieval figures (including an axe-wielding executioner), carved caricatures of Vincent Massey, his wife Alice, his father Chester, and architects Sproatt and Rolph.

Shields in the bay windows of the south block - Arms of Edward Prince of Wales; emblems of military divisions housed at the then incomplete Hart House during WWI.

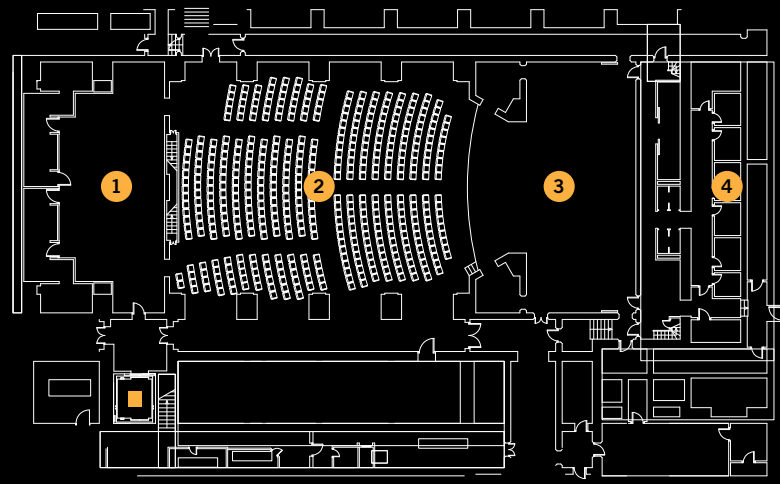
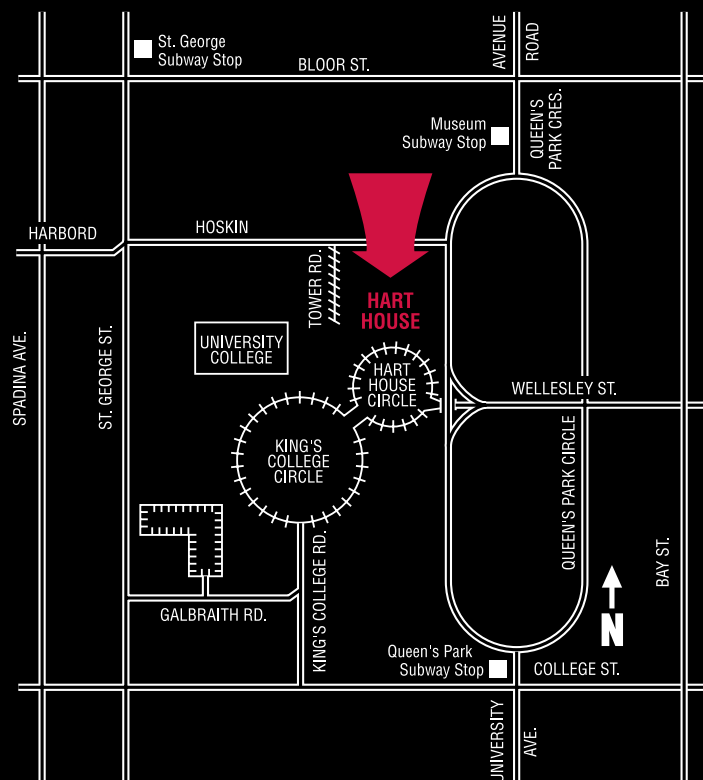
Completed in 1919, Hart House is a crown jewel in the University of Toronto's architectural, academic and social history. Designed by architect Henry Sproatt, one of the last North American masters of the Gothic form, and engineer Ernest Rolph, the building is named for Vincent Massey's grandfather, Hart. Hart House was gifted to the University of Toronto by the Massey Foundation as a gathering place for students. Today, Hart House enjoys a reputation as a signature arts, creativity and event destination in the City of Toronto. The Hart House permanent art collection comprises nearly six-hundred works by renowned Canadian artists, including works considered national treasures by the Group of Seven, major works by the Automatistes and Painters Eleven, as well as contemporary works by artists from across the country. Hart House is open 365 days a year.

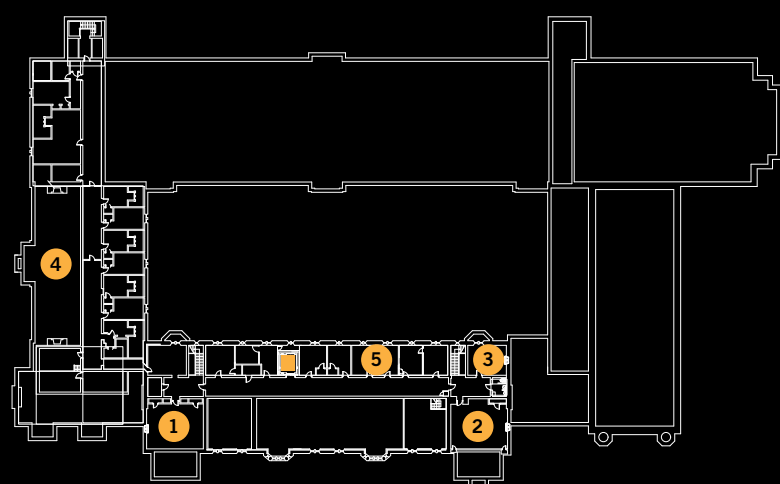

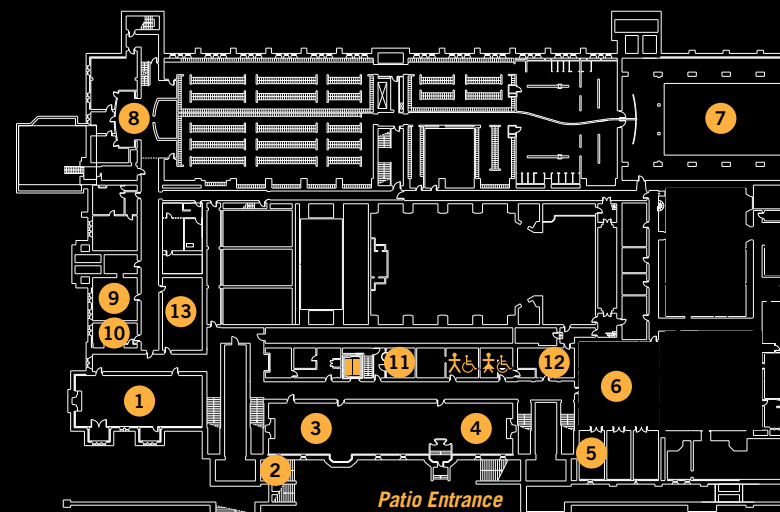
SUB BASEMENT (Hart House Theatre)

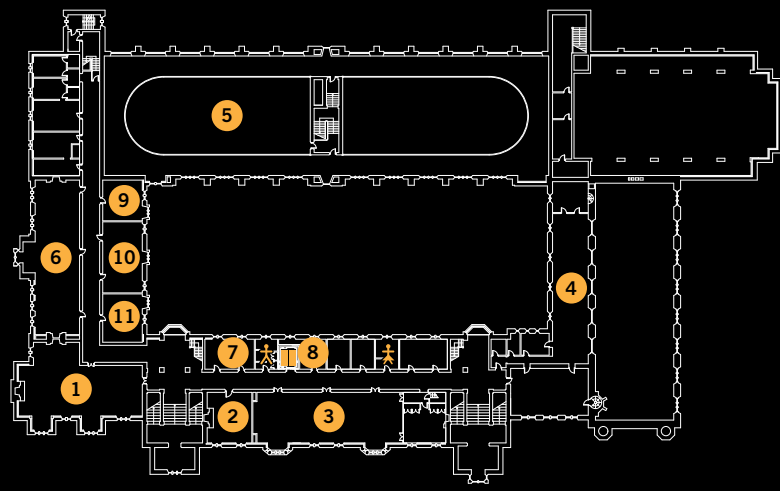
